### Minutes of Our Last Meeting

March 16th, 2010

The Thomas Nelson, Jr. Chapter held its Eagle Scout Scholarship Award Meeting at the Point Plaza Suites in Newport News. After the Call to Order, Invocation, the Pledge of Allegiance, and SAR Pledge, President Jim Swords made opening remarks and introduced distinguished guests.

The Chapter was pleased to listen to Compatriot Sam Endicott as he shared a wealth of information about Patriot Brigadier General Thaddeus Kosciusko (1746 – 1817), who, among many great things, served as Head Engineer of the Continental Army, and fortified Philadelphia as well as Canadian border posts and West Point. General Kosciusko also established a fortified depot at Halifax, VA.

The guest speaker was Col. Dennis D. McSweeney, US Army (Ret.), who shared with the Chapter his presentation, entitled "Getting Personal With the Day to Day Challenges of the Revolutionary War Soldier/Patriot". A part of his presentation, Col. McSweeney also presented a number of implements that were common to the soldiers of the Revolutionary War and demonstrated little-known facts about their purposes and functions. Col. McSweeney enlisted the aid of the Eagle Scout Scholarhip awardee, Alan Booth, and his younger brother to assist in the demonstrations.



He moved to Williamsburg from Fairfax, Va. in 2003 and has worked as a museum costumed interpreter for Jamestown Yorktown Foundation for 5 years at the Yorktown Victory Center. For 3 years he has served as a volunteer Militia interpreter for Colonial Williamsburg and for 2 years has participated with a British Royal Artillery unit at the Yorktown National Historic Park.

In costume Bob will discuss how the Continental soldier lived and such things as how and what they ate? He will answer such questions such as if they were sick who treated them? What were their chances of survival? Did they really stand in straight lines and fire at one another? Were they citizen soldiers or trained professionals? These and more questions will be answered through an presentation interactive demonstration of the life, activities and military practices of the common soldier during the American Revolution. Bob's presentation style is not only educational but lively and entertaining.
